



Recommendation 146 (1957)¹

Relations between the Council of Europe, the European Economic Community (EEC) and the European Atomic Energy Community

Parliamentary Assembly

The Assembly,

Having welcomed the resolution of the six Foreign Ministers which is designed to ensure partial identity of membership between the Assembly of the six-Power Communities and the Consultative Assembly ;

Considering that other steps must be taken to preserve and ensure a sense of common purpose between those engaged in building up the six-Power Communities and those belonging to the wider European Community,

Recommends to the Committee of Ministers that they should without delay make arrangements with the six Governments through the Interim Committee for the Common Market and Euratom, or otherwise as may be appropriate, to ensure that relations between the Council of Europe and the new Communities are at least as close as those between the Council of Europe and the Coal and Steel Community as described in the Protocol signed at Paris on 18th April 1951, with special reference to the right of the Committee of Ministers to send recommendations to the High Authority of the Coal and Steel Community.
