



Recommendation 1782 (2007)¹

The situation of migrant workers in temporary employment agencies (TEAs)

Parliamentary Assembly

1. The Parliamentary Assembly refers to its [Resolution 1534 \(2007\)](#) on the situation of migrant workers in temporary employment agencies (TEAs).
2. In this context the Assembly recommends that the Committee of Ministers ask the relevant intergovernmental committees to develop co-operation programmes with the International Labour Organization (ILO) and the European Union in order to:
 - 2.1. research existing patterns of abusive practice in the transnational recruitment of temporary workers;
 - 2.2. assist member states, particularly non- European Union member states, in developing and enforcing strategies to combat irregular recruitment and trafficking of workers;
 - 2.3. assist member states, particularly non- European Union member states, to regulate labour recruitment and to apply efficient enforcement mechanisms (labour inspection, dissuasive sanctions, penalties including criminal prosecution);
 - 2.4. assist member states in developing information campaigns on the rights of migrant workers and their working conditions.
