## House arrest of the Russian librarian, Ms Natalya Sharina

### Written question No. 718 to the Committee of Ministers

Ms Natalya Sharina, Director of the Library of Ukrainian Literature in Moscow, has been under house arrest since October 2015 after being accused of inciting hatred or animosity towards a social group by allegedly holding banned books in the Library. Natalya was subsequently arrested, and then placed under house arrest.
